

STALL REFUND

The Society will pay £25 per head of dairy and beef cattle, forward at the Show, (this will only include calves at foot, if an additional stall has been booked for the calf). Exhibitors must collect the above payments before leaving the Show, from the cashier's office in Bingley Hall between 3.15pm & 4.30pm, on the Thursday of the show.

MILK ALLOWANCE

Due to problems with contamination and traceability it is regretted that the Society no longer makes any payment to exhibitors for milk. However, the Society will make a payment of £25 per head of dairy cattle forward in the cow or heifer in milk classes. The above payments will be paid out from the cashier's office in Bingley Hall between 3.15pm & 4.30pm, on the Thursday of the show along with all prize money.

GRAND PARADE OF LIVESTOCK - Kindly Sponsored by Bagshaws Auctioneers

All Champion winners are required to parade and The Society reserves the right to withhold prize money if an animal does not take part in the parade on both days. All exhibitors forward for the Grand Parade of livestock, will be entered into a raffle to win a cash prize of £100 for each parade, kindly sponsored by R Peacock Showground Services.

STALLING

A stalls size is approx. 4ft x 8ft and exhibitors are required to reserve a minimum of 1 stall per animal entered. Exhibitors may reserve any number of stalls to house the total number of cattle they intend to bring; moreover, exhibitors are to book a stall for fodder storage. However, the Society reserves the right to limit the number of stalls allocated to each exhibitor and to reallocate empty stalls in the event of animals not being forward at the Show. If an exhibitor wishes to cancel their entry prior to and including 10th May 2024, stall fees will be refunded.

EXHIBITOR TICKETS

Exhibitor tickets will be issued in relation to the number of animals entered as detailed below: $1 + 2 \times (1 + 2 \times 5)$ Animals - $4 \times (1 \times 5)$ Animals - $4 \times (1 \times 5)$ Animals - $4 \times (1 \times 5)$ Extra tickets may be purchased at time of entry at the special reduced price of £16.00 per one-day ticket. However, it should be noted that no additional complimentary tickets will be issued other than in accordance with the above ratio.

MEAL VOUCHERS

Complimentary Stockmen's vouchers will be issued, for use in either the Bingley Hall Café or the Grandstand Café, on the following basis:

ARRIVAL OF CATTLE

Cattle may arrive between 8.00am and 10.00pm on Tuesday. After 10.00pm there will be no access to the showground until the gates reopen between 6.00am & 8.00am on Wednesday. All livestock must be on the Showground by 8.00 am on the Wednesday in readiness for judging at the time in the schedule.

FORAGE AND STRAW

Straw for bedding purposes will kindly be provided by Thorley Bros & Staffordshire & Birmingham Agricultural Society for each exhibitor. Exhibitors will be able to collect the straw from the designated area. Exhibitors are required to make their own arrangements for all forage requirements.

CARAVAN PARKING/STOCKMEN'S ACCOMMODATION

Limited camping and caravan parking facilities are available within the Stafford Car Park. No charge is made for this facility; however, a permit must be obtained from the showground Office at least 28 days prior to the show. It is regretted that electrical connections for caravans are not available. In accordance with Health & Safety legislation caravans, camping and light vehicles will not be allowed to park at the rear of Bingley Hall. Furthermore, all caravans must be parked in the designated area within the Stafford Car Park within the marked-out pitches. Any caravan that either fails to display a valid parking permit or parks outside the designated pitches will be removed. All tents must be pitched in the designated area within Lower Berry Hill Wood adjacent to the caravan parking area in the Stafford Car Park. Please note that vehicles are strictly prohibited from entering the Lower Berry Hill Wood camping area. No stockmen's accommodation is available on site, however, shower and toilet facilities are available in Bingley Hall. Note: Caravans are not permitted to arrive on the Showground before 8am on Tuesday 28th May 2024

CATERING

Catering facilities will be open on Tuesday from 10am until 8pm, on Wednesday 6am until 7pm & Thursday from 6am until 6pm.

GENERAL CATTLE REGULATIONS:

- 1.The health of all animals and people present during the Staffordshire County Show is of paramount importance to the organisers. As such, we would like to remind Livestock exhibitors of their responsibilities with respect to the health of their animals. Only fit and healthy animals should be transported to the Show. Any clinical signs of disease, however mild, detected on farm must result in the affected animal(s) remaining at home and not travelling to the Show. Once on the Showground, if any animals develop any signs of illness one of the show veterinarians should be alerted immediately.
- 2.Cattle exhibitors are not permitted to enter any animal in more than one breed section. Accordingly, exhibitors must enter an animal into a Breed section where available and only enter an Any Other section if a Breed class is unavailable, with exception to the Rare breeds classes. However, it should be noted that this rule does not apply to the Calf Classes on the Thursday of the Show.
- 3.Any section within this schedule will be cancelled if there are less than three exhibitors in the section, however, this ruling does not apply to Senior Bull classes.
 If a UK Native Breed Section has insufficient exhibitors to run the entries will be amalgamated with the Any Other Native Breed Classes.
 If a Continental Breed Section has insufficient Exhibitors to run the entries will be
 - amalgamated with the Any Other Continental Classes.

 If there are 3 Exhibitors or 4 animals of one breed in a class within the Any Other Native or Any Other Continental sections, these would be split into a separate class for that breed.
- 4. **Entries in Group Classes** must be made at the time of entry; please note that an exhibitor may enter more than one Group.
- 5.An animal is defined as "**Exhibitor Bred**" if it is born on the owners' farm and carries the owners' prefix. This includes animals born as a result of embryo transplant. An animal in joint ownership does not qualify as exhibitor bred.
- 6. TWO SUBSTITUTIONS PER EXHIBITOR will be accepted up to 4.30pm on Thursday 23rd May 2024.
- 7. Dairy Cattle Exhibitors please note: Animals entered in the In-Calf classes, calved prior to the Show, will automatically be transferred to the In-Milk classes but THEY CANNOT be transferred from the In-Milk to In-Calf classes. Exhibitors with any doubt should enter the In-Calf classes.
- 8.TB Test is required in accordance with DEFRA regulations. Please note the change to TB testing regulations that came into force in August 2023.
 - THE SHOWGROUND IS CURRENTLY IN A <u>6 MONTHLY</u> TESTING AREA. SHOWGROUND HOLDING NUMBER 37/197/8001
- 9. Cattle exhibitors must place all rubbish that is not straw, animal feed or manure into one of the rubbish bins provided. Separation of rubbish from the manure pile causes the SBAS considerable extra work so your adherence to this request and efforts made to keep the cattle lines clean and tidy are appreciated.

DAIRY SECTION

MILK ALLOWANCE - Staffordshire & Birmingham Agricultural Society will make a payment of £25 per head of dairy cattle forward in the cow or heifer in milk classes. The above payments will be paid out from the cashier's office in Bingley Hall, along with all prize money, on the Thursday of the Show.

HOLSTEIN

(Incorporating British Friesian Breeders Club)

All entries are to be registered in either the Herd Book of Holstein UK or Class B of the appropriate Supplementary Register. Registration certificates should be available at the Show for inspection if required by a representative of the Society. Calving dates of animals in the appropriate classes will be checked with the appropriate Breed Society.

PLEASE NOTE: Holsteins & Jerseys will share a showing ring and alternate classes.

Class 100/101 Junior Heifer, born on or after the 1st January 2023

Note: This class will be split on the day into 2 equal classes by age if more than 10 entries are forward.

Class 102 Red & White Junior Heifer, born on or after the 1st January 2023

Note: If there are less than 3 forward this class will be amalgamated with class 100/101.

Class 103 Heifer in Calf with first calf, not more than three years old on first day of Show and due to calve at not more than 3 years and 1 month.

Class 104 Cow in Calf, not less than 5 months, born in or before 2018, 2019, 2020 or 2021.

Class 105/106 Heifer in milk, calved at under 3 years of age.

Note: Class 105/106 will be split on the day into 2 classes by age, if more than 8 entries are forward.

Class 107 Red & White Heifer in milk, calved at under 3 years of age.

Note: If there are less than 3 forward this class will be amalgamated with class 105/106.

Class 108 Junior Cow in milk, having calved twice

Class 109 Intermediate Cow in milk, having calved 3 times

Class 110 Senior Cow in milk, having calved 4 times or more

Class 111 Red & White Cow in milk, 4 years old and over having had three calves or more

Note: If there are less than 3 forward the entries will be amalgamated with the relevant class.

Class 112 Cow, having a total lifetime yield of not less than 50 tonnes

Class 113 Production/Inspection Class, for cows in Classes 104, 108, 109, 110, 111 & 112.

Cows with at least one record of over 10,000Kgs of milk in 305 days. Points will be awarded for the best consecutive two lactations, weight of fat and protein.

Inspection points will be added to production points to determine placing.

Method of scoring;

Inspection points - Maximum 400 points minimum 150.

Calving Interval - Add 1 point for each day under 400 days; deduct 1 point for each day over 400 days.

Production points - The average weight of fat and protein for the two consecutive lactations to be taken, one point will be awarded for each 2Kg fat and protein.

Milk Recording Certificates must be forwarded to the Show Secretary together with the cattle entry form.

GENERAL REGULATIONS

- 1. The health of all animals and people present during the Staffordshire County Show is of paramount importance to the organisers. As such, we would like to remind Livestock exhibitors of their responsibilities with respect to the health of their animals. Only fit and healthy animals should be transported to the Show. Any clinical signs of disease, however mild, detected on farm must result in the affected animal(s) remaining at home and not travelling to the Show. Once on the Showground, if any animals develop any signs of illness one of the show veterinarians should be alerted immediately.
- 2. Sheep must be penned, and all livestock vehicles parked in the livestock car park by 8am on Wednesday. Exhibitors arriving after this time might, at the discretion of the Chief Sheep Steward, forfeit their eligibility to partake in competition.

As such, we would like to remind Livestock exhibitors of their responsibilities with respect to the health of their animals. Only fit and healthy animals should be transported to the Show. Any clinical signs of disease, however mild, detected on farm must result in the affected animal(s) remaining at home and not travelling to the Show. Once on the Showground, if any animals develop any signs of illness one of the show veterinarians should be alerted immediately.
- 2. Pigs must be on the Showground by 8am on Wednesday morning for judging commencing at 9.30am and will be required to remain at the Show until after the Grand Parade on Thursday.
- 3. Exhibitors are to provide their own forage requirements.
- 4. Moves to this show must be pre-notified via the new electronic pig movement licensing system ('eAML2') and <u>A COPY OF THE 'ON' MOVEMENT MUST BE HANDED TO A</u>

 <u>STEWARD ON ARRIVAL AT THE SHOW.</u> Copies of the new haulier Summary movement document, which must accompany pigs throughout the journey to the show and their return journey to the premises of origin, can be obtained from the 'eAML2' system directly when pre-notifying the move online on www.eaml2.org.uk or alternatively from the eAML2 Bureau Service, which will pre-notify the movement onto the 'eAML2' system on the exhibitor's behalf, and then send the appropriate number of copies of the Haulier Summary document to accompany the animals in transit.
- 5. At the discretion of the Committee, if insufficient entries, classes will be amalgamated.
- 6. If there are 3 exhibitors of the same breed in a section, they shall be transferred to separate classes for that breed, at the discretion of the chief steward.
- 7. Classes open to all BPA Members.
- 8. BPA rosettes will be awarded only to members of the British Pig Association.
- 9. BPA registered pigs must be identified by ear notch or tattoo. The identities of pigs forward will be checked against catalogue entries.

- 10.Identifying information of each exhibit to be recorded on entry form ear number, Herd book number, date of birth, registered name, breeder.
- 11. Classes are held under BPA Special Conditions.

BPA SPECIAL CONDITIONS:

- 1. Pigs to have been registered in a published volume or accepted for entry in a forthcoming volume of the British Pig Association's Herd Book. (It is not sufficient for an animal to be 'eligible for registration'). Animals registered in a Grading register of a Herd book are not eligible for entry in Agricultural Show Classes. The ear number, registered name, Herd Book number and date of birth of each pig must be supplied for printing in the catalogue together with the name of the breeder in cases where the exhibitor is not also breeder.
- 2. At all Shows in 2024, female pigs (all breeds) born before 1st January 2023 shall be eligible to compete only if in the six calendar months prior to the Show they have farrowed, suckled and reared to four weeks of age, a birth notified litter of pigs.
- 3. At all Shows in 2024, female pigs born on or after 1st January and before 1st July in the year before the Show, must within 18 months of their date of birth have farrowed, suckled and reared to four weeks of age, a birth notified litter of pigs.
- 4. Boars of two years of age and over (all breed) are to be certified as having sired at least three litters within the twelve months preceding the first day of the show. The pigs comprising such litters are to have been litter notified in the British Pig Association's Herd book.
- 5. Boars aged twelve months or more at the time of exhibition, must have their tusks cut prior to the Show.
- 6. <u>All Boars must be shown by two competent handlers who are equipped with protective</u> boards.
- 7. The use of artificial colouring, whitening and/or powder on pigs as well as the removal or addition of spots by artificial means is prohibited (white woodflour is permitted).

- 1. Qualifying rounds will be arranged at Agricultural Shows, leading to a final.
- 2. A condition of entering the competition is that prize winners at preliminary rounds must intend to exhibit in the final, at The Great Yorkshire Show 2024.
- 3. The award is open to all breeds of pedigree pigs entered in our Show. The object is to determine the best modern and traditional breed pigs as an example of their respective breeds.
- 4. All animals entered in this Competition must be the property of a member of the British Pig Association or the British Lop Society and must be registered in a herd book of The British Pig Association or the British Lop Pig Society.
- 5. Judges must be chosen from the BPA "All Breeds" Judges List. They may only act for one qualifying round.

 The judge of the Final will not have acted for a qualifying round.
- 6. Classes from which pigs are chosen, and therefore eligible for qualifying rounds, must be judged by a BPA approved judge.
- 7. To be eligible for a qualifying round a pig (male or female) must be born on or after 1st July of the year previous to the Show (see 9 below). A Pig judged best male (Modern or Traditional) or Best Female (Modern or Traditional) in a qualifying round cannot compete in any subsequent round. If a pig having qualified at an earlier Show again qualifies at a later show the judge for that breed shall select an alternative pig of the same breed and sex from any class covering the required age group.
- 8. Where a single breed has more than one class covering the required age group for either sex, so permitting more than one 1st prize animal, the judge must nominate one of these for the qualifying round.
- 9. Where there are multi-breed classes, i.e. any other modern/any other traditional breed or similar classification, the judge must nominate the best male and female of the qualifying age of each breed represented (regardless of class prizes). These pigs will compete in the qualifying round with eligible entries from individual breed classes.
- At each qualifying round the judge will select the Best Male from a Modern Breed, Best Male from a Traditional Breed. Best Female from a Modern Breed, Best Female from a Traditional Breed and Best Pig.
- 11. Prize money for preliminary rounds will be £10 for the best Modern Breed pig of each sex and £10 for best Traditional Breed pig of each sex, £10 and a glass Trophy for the overall winner. Note: Rosettes only will be presented at each preliminary round. Prize monies and glass trophies for preliminary rounds will be presented at the final.
- 12. The Best Males Modern and Traditional and Best Females Modern and Traditional from each of the qualifying rounds will qualify for the final to be held at the Great Yorkshire Show.
- 13. The Final will be to judge the Best Modern Male and Female with Reserves and the Best Traditional Male and Female with Reserves; the Best Pig (i.e. Pig of the Year) and Reserve.
- 14. In the final at Great Yorkshire Show the Modern and Traditional Male and Female Champions will each receive £60. Reserve Champions £30, Overall Champion £200 and The Geoffrey Cloke Memorial Salver, and Reserve £150.
- 15. A travel allowance of 20p per mile will be paid by the Great Yorkshire Show to exhibitors attending the final.

- 5. Judges must be chosen from the BPA "All Breeds" Judges List. They may only act for one qualifying round. The judge of the final will not have acted for a qualifying round.
- 6. Classes from which pigs are chosen, and therefore eligible for qualifying rounds, must be judged by a BPA approved judge.
- 7. To be eligible for a qualifying round a pig (male or female) must be born on or after 1st January of the year of the show (see 9 below). A pig judged Best Young Male or Best Young Female in a qualifying round cannot compete in any subsequent round. If a pig having qualified at an earlier Show again qualifies at a later show the judge for that breed shall select an alternative pig of the same breed and sex from any class covering the required age group.
- 8. Where a single breed has more than one class covering the required age group for either sex, so permitting more than one 1st prize animal, the judge must nominate one of these for the qualifying round.
- 9. Where multi-breed classes, i.e. any other modern / any other traditional breed or a similar classification, the judge must nominate the best male and best female of the qualifying age of each breed represented (regardless of class prizes). These pigs will compete in the qualifying round with eligible entries from individual breed classes.
- 10.At each qualifying round the judge will select the Best Young Male and Best Young Female.
- 11. The Best Young Male and Best Young Female from each of the qualifying rounds will enter the final. Prizes for preliminary rounds will be a glass Trophy for the best pig of each sex.

FORAGE AND STRAW

Straw for bedding purposes will kindly be provided by Thorley Bros & Staffordshire & Birmingham Agricultural Society for each exhibitor. Exhibitors will be able to collect the straw from the designated area. Exhibitors are required to make their own arrangements for all forage requirements.

CARAVAN PARKING/STOCKMEN'S ACCOMMODATION

Limited camping and caravan parking facilities are available within the Stafford Car Park. No charge is made for this facility; however, a permit must be obtained from the showground Office at least 28 days prior to the show. It is regretted that electrical connections for caravans are not available. In accordance with Health & Safety legislation caravans, camping and light vehicles will not be allowed to park at the rear of Bingley Hall.

Furthermore, all caravans must be parked in the designated area within the Stafford Car Park within the marked-out pitches. Any caravan that either fails to display a valid parking permit or parks outside the designated pitches will be removed. All tents must be pitched in the designated area within Lower Berry Hill Wood adjacent to the caravan parking area in the Stafford Car Park. Please note that vehicles are strictly prohibited from entering the Lower Berry Hill Wood camping area. No stockmen's accommodation is available on site, however, shower and toilet facilities are available in Bingley Hall. Note: Caravans are not permitted to arrive on the Showground before 8am on Tuesday 28th May 2024

THIS SECTION IS JUDGED UNDER THE FOLLOWING REGULATIONS:

- 1. The health of all animals and people present during the Staffordshire County Show is of paramount importance to the organisers. As such, we would like to remind Livestock exhibitors of their responsibilities with respect to the health of their animals.
- Only fit and healthy animals should be transported to the Show. Any clinical signs of disease, however mild, detected on farm must result in the affected animal(s) remaining at home and not travelling to the Show. Once on the Showground, if any animals develop any signs of illness one of the show veterinarians should be alerted immediately.
- 2.All exhibitors to comply with DEFRA Rules. Exhibitors are reminded that movement of Goats must be made under General Licence. Exhibitors who are unsure of the requirements are advised to contact their local Animal Health Division Office for further information.
- 3. The Goat Classes are held under the rules, regulations and recognition of the BBGS. All exhibits must be registered with the BBGS as in the ownership of BBGS members and in the name of the exhibitor, the registered name and number being quoted on the entry form. Handlers to be BBGS full or showing members.
- 4. The Society reserves the right, at their discretion, to amalgamate classes which have less than three entries. Any section may be cancelled if there are less than 3 exhibitors in the section or less than 4 entries per class.
- 5. **NO PREGNANT GOAT MAY BE ADMITTED TO THE SHOWGROUND**. In the event of an unforeseen kidding or abortion, the goat must be immediately isolated from other goats. Full details of the goat, exhibitor and action taken must be reported in writing by the Chief Steward to the BBGS Secretary immediately after the Show.
- 6. All animals must be under control and are responsibility of the exhibitor. Animals that are deemed not under control may be removed from the Show ring or Showground.
- 7. All goats must be CAE Accredited with SRUC; furthermore, the relevant forms must be handed in to the Stewards on arrival at the Showground.

NOTES, RULES AND REGULATIONS

- 1. **Covered Accommodation for Stock.** Permanent covered accommodation will be provided for Cattle, Sheep and Pigs with a marquee for the Boer Goats.
- 2. **Forage & Straw.** Straw for bedding purposes will kindly be provided by Thorley Bros & Staffordshire & Birmingham Agricultural Society for each exhibitor. Exhibitors will be able to collect the straw from the designated area. Exhibitors are required to make their own arrangements for all forage requirements.
- 3. **Exhibits Ownership at Entry.** All animals must be bona-fide the property of the exhibitor at the time of entry.
- 4. **Arrival of Exhibits.** All animals must arrive at the Showground by 8.00 am on the first morning of the Show in readiness for judging at the time in the schedule, but not before 8am on Tuesday.
- 5. **Period Exhibits required to remain at the Show.** All Cattle, Sheep, Pigs & Goats will be required to remain for inspection until after the Grand Parade on Thursday.
- 6. Responsibility. The Organisers of this Show have taken all reasonable precautions to ensure the health and safety of everyone present. For these measures to be effective, everyone must take all reasonable precautions to avoid and prevent accidents occurring and must obey the instructions of the Organisers and all the Officials and Stewards. The Society, its Officers or Servants or Agents shall not be responsible for any injury, damage or loss however caused to any animal, article, or other property belonging to the exhibitor and the exhibitor agrees to indemnify the Society in respect of any costs in connection with any claims made upon the Society as a result of the actions or omissions of the exhibitor or of any employee of the exhibitor. Each exhibitor shall be solely responsible for any loss, injury or damage that may be done to, or occasioned by or arising from any animal, article or property exhibited or brought on to the Showground by him and he shall indemnify and hold harmless the Society from and against all actions, suits, expenses and claims on account of or in respect of any such damage or injury which may be so caused or occasioned. The Society, its Officers or Servants will not be liable for any errors or mistakes that may happen in placing or penning the stock or articles to be exhibited but the servants in charge of the same must see that they are placed according to their entries. The Society expects all exhibitors to have had experience in display of livestock at Shows and all exhibitors should be aware of the distractions that can be caused to exhibits in their possession during the course of the event.

7. By completing an entry, you are conforming to the following

You are stating that you understand, confirm and agree to the following statement: "To the best of my knowledge and belief, the animal(s) I have entered is/are free from any clinical disease. I further declare that all necessary precautions will be taken to prevent the said animal(s) from being exposed to infectious or contagious diseases. In the event that my animals(s) are suspected of suffering from any disease or infection either on arrival at or during the Show I agree to the animal(s) being isolated and for any test or tests being undertaken in the animal(s) as deemed necessary by the Society's veterinary surgeon to determine whether or not the animal(s) are suffering from a disease or infection. Each and all the particulars given are correct to the best of my knowledge and belief; that these animals are my own property; and that they are duly qualified, according to the Society's regulations and conditions, to compete for the prize or prizes for which they are entered.

To conform, as an exhibitor, to all the Regulations, Conditions and Orders of the Staffordshire & Birmingham Agricultural Society; to hold the Society blameless in the event of any illness, loss or damage occurring to, or through, any animal I may enter or exhibit at the Show, or of mis-delivery of the same: and to indemnify the Society against any legal proceeding arising from any such illness, loss, damage or misdelivery"

- 8. **Attendants.** Exhibitors or their attendants must remain with their exhibits during the whole time they are at the Show and must comply with and be governed by the Society's Rules and Regulations.
- 9. **Halters and Ties.** All stock must be provided with ties and all Cattle must be halter-led in the rings. Big Jims will not be allowed.
- 10.**Bulls.** All Bulls above twelve months old shall have rings or "bull-dogs" in their noses and be provided with leading sticks. No persons under the age of 18 or over the age of 65 shall be allowed to lead bulls. Two handlers must accompany bulls in the Grand Parade.
- 11. Judges. The Judges named in the Society's Prize Schedule and the Show Catalogue or Programme have consented and have been appointed to act as Judges in the events indicated. The Committee reserves the right to appoint substitutes for any who may be unavoidably prevented from attending and all entries are accepted upon that understanding.
- 12.**Judging.** Judging will commence, as near as circumstances allow, at the times stated in the Schedule under the respective sectional headings and exhibitors will be held responsible for their exhibits being in the Judging Ring at the proper time.
- 13. Certificates of Calving. The prizes awarded to in-calf cows may be withheld until a certificate has been delivered to the Chief Executive of each of the animals having produced a calf within three months from the date of the Show.
- 14. Cattle "In-Milk" Classes. Cows or heifers entered as "in-calf", calving just prior to the Show will be eligible to compete in the "in-milk" class without payment of an extra fee, but cows entered "in-milk" may not be shown as "in-calf".
- 15. Fixing & Tampering. Any artificial contrivance or device of any description found on or proved to have been used on an animal at any time whilst that animal is in the Showground, either for preventing the flow of milk or for any other improper purpose, will disqualify that animal from being awarded a prize, and any prize awarded prior to discovery will be forfeited. The Instigator or The Owner of the said animal may be prohibited from again entering Stock for any of the Society's Shows, for such period as the Committee may see fit. For the purpose of this Regulation, the term 'improper practice' shall be held to include setting of teats, and generally any other practice including tampering or of their own or any other animal by the exhibitor or any other person which results in the animals being shown other than in a natural state, and the Society reserves the right to have all animals inspected by the Society's Veterinary Officers, either prior to, during, or after judging. The Society will not tolerate the administration to show exhibits (entered either for competition or sale/demonstration) of tranquillisers or other drugs which may in any way affect the performance of the animal in question to have the effect of making it behave in the show ring in a manner which is not natural. The Society reserves the right to take any necessary samples from any animal about which a Steward or Judge has suspicion of drugs being used to gain unfair advantage. Any Person or Exhibitor (or his representative) who is found to have administered or permitted the

- administration of any such tranquilliser or drugs to any Show exhibit will be reported to the Organising Committee, and dealt with at their discretion. In addition, the matter will be referred to the appropriate Breed Society or Organisation.
- 16.**Sheep.** Exhibits must not be coloured other than in accordance with the conditions of the respective Breed Association Societies.
- 17.**Protests.** Any Exhibitor wishing to lodge an objection, having reference to Livestock exhibited on the first day of the show, must make the objection, in writing, to the Chief Executive not later than 12 noon on the succeeding day and to any exhibited on the second day of the Show before 3 p.m. in the afternoon of that day, or within seven days from the date of the Show, when the evidence to substantiate the protest cannot be obtained on the days of the Show. The person giving such notice must lodge the sum of £50.00 in the hands of the Chief Executive, as a guarantee that he will attend a meeting of the Society's Committee of which he will have notice, and support his case. If he does not so attend the deposit of £50.00 will be forfeited to the Society.
- 18.**Stewards Power to Enforce Regulations.** The Committee delegates full power to the Stewards to enforce the Society's Rules and Regulations.
- 19. Parades of Stock. Separate parades of Horses and Livestock will take place on both days of the Show at times to be arranged by the Stewards and all exhibitors or their attendants must be in readiness to parade their animals accordingly. The only exception to this will be non-MV Accredited Sheep, which will not be required to parade. The Society reserves the right to withhold prize money if an animal does not take part in the parade on both days. Two handlers must always accompany bulls in the grand parade.
- 20.**Exhibitors' Vehicles.** All vehicles must be parked at the places provided and must not under any circumstances be left in the stock lines or other avenues. All entries are accepted on the understanding that this instruction will be complied with.
- 21. **Trophies, Cups & Shields.** Unless otherwise stated, all trophies are to be held for one year.
- 22. **Calculation of Points.** In calculating the points won by an exhibitor for the award of Champion or other Special Prizes, only those prizes which have been won in classes sponsored by the Society shall be included. Prizes won in special classes shall not be eligible for points.
- 23. **Cattle Section Champion Prizes.** The Judge of each breed section will nominate one animal to go forward to the judging of the Cattle Section Champion.
- 24. **Interpretation of the Rules and Regulations.** The Society reserves to itself by its committee the sole and absolute right to interpret these Rules and Regulations or any other prescribed Conditions arbitrarily to settle and determine all matters, questions or differences in regard thereto, or otherwise arising out of or connected with or incidental to the Show. Also, to refuse or cancel any entries, to postpone or abandon the Show and relax conditions as the Society may deem expedient.
- 24. **Grand Parade.** All handlers who are eligible to appear in the Grand Parade **MUST** wear White Coats, unless their Breed Society states otherwise, or has its own dress code.
- 25. **Leading Animals.** It is a condition of the Show that children must only handle animals where they have the necessary strength and experience to cope with foreseeable problems. Children must always be under the supervision of a competent adult.
